o Works Cited Page - Must have a minimum of 3 sources (not Wikipedia)

o Your research paper should answer the following prompt:

Why are this composer and this work significant to 19th century music? Include the musical context of the 19th century, a biography/overview of your selected composer and musical work, and why you selected this particular piece.

• Presentation - TEST GRADE - Due TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29th

o 8-10 minutes in length

o Power point, trifold board, or skit format

o At least one slide/side/scene devoted to your selected composer

o At least one slide/side/scene devoted to your selected piece of music.

o An attachment to a recording of the piece of music.

Listening:

Find a piece of music the fully exemplifies your chosen composer. Many composers are known for a specific style of music; some are very well known for their contributions to Opera while others may be known for piano or art song compositions. Your research about your composer should lead you easily to the style of music on which to focus.
